


chandelier earrings


you will need the following supplies:



Step 1: Put a bead onto a headpin. Bend the headpin on an angle backward at the top of the bead.




Step 2: Grip the headpin 1/4" from the top of the bead with your cone nose pliers, begin to bend the headpin forward.



Step 3: Continue bending the headpin in the same direction until it forms a loop at the top of the bead. Make several "looped beads" and set aside if you desire.




Step 4: Grip the top portion of the loop with your cone nose pliers to hold the "looped bead" in place. This will also save the hoop from distortion during the next step.




Step 5: Grip the tail end of the headpin with your fingers and begin to wrap the tail around the neck of the "looped bead."




Step 6: Wrap at least 1.5 times around or until it meets the top of the bead. (If you desire a cap design keep wrapping the wire down the bead.) Cut off the remainder of the tail with the cutters.



Step 7: Cut off 2" of wire. A) Make a loop at one end. B) Attach the open loop onto the hoop of your previous bead. C) Wrap tail around the neck of the bead at least 1.5 times. Cut off tail.



Step 8: Add a bead and repeat steps 1-6. Repeat this step over and over until desired length has been achieved.



Step 9: Make 5 bead chains at various lengths, for one earring.



Step 7: Begin to attach bead chains to your chandelier base by opening the hoops on the base, attaching the bead chain and then re-closing the hoop with your pliers.



Step 8: Continue to add all your bead chains.



Step 9: Attach your ear wire by opening the loop on the ear wire, attach it to the top loop on the chandelier earring. Close the loop back up again. Repeat steps 1-9 for to make other earring.
