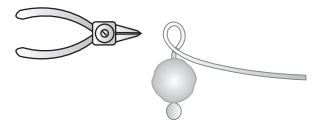
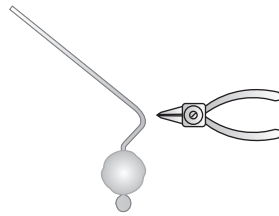
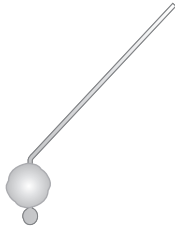
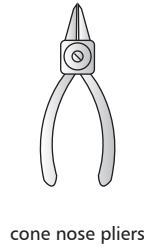
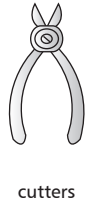
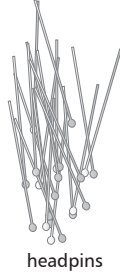
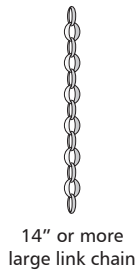


# cluster necklace

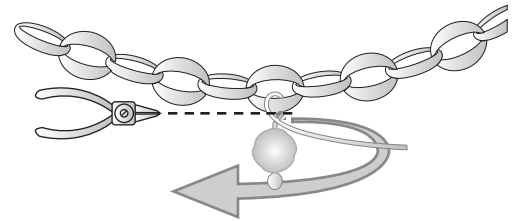
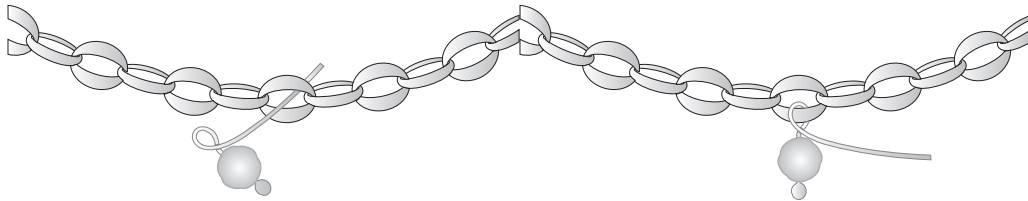
you will need the following supplies:



**Step 1:** Put a bead onto a headpin. Bend the headpin on an angle backward at the top of the bead.

**Step 2:** Grip the headpin 1/4" from the top of the bead with your cone nose pliers and begin to bend the headpin forward.

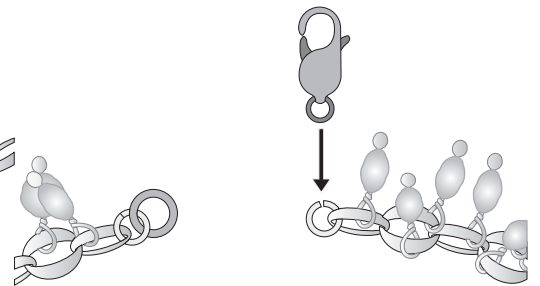
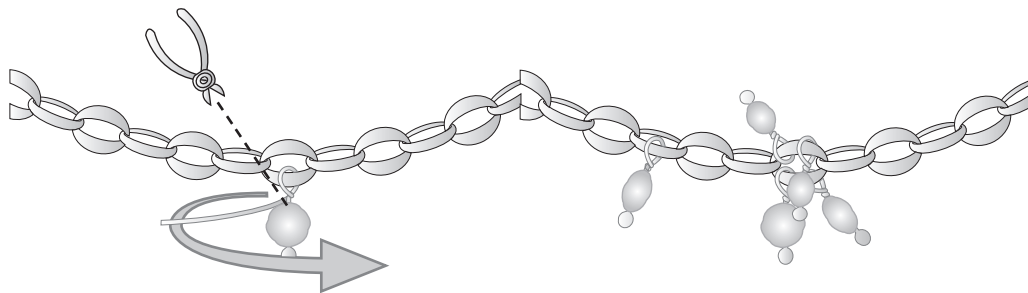
**Step 3:** Continue bending the headpin in the same direction until it forms a loop at the top of the bead. Make several "looped beads" and set aside if you desire.



**Step 4:** Attach your "looped bead" on any chain link you wish. Thread the tail of the "looped bead" through a chain link.

**Step 5:** Slide tail all the way through until it pops into place on the chain.

**Step 6:** Brace across the loop with your cone nose pliers to hold in place and grip the tail end of the Headpin with you fingers and begin to wrap the tail around the neck of the "looped bead."



**Step 7:** Wrap at least 1.5 times around or until it meets the top of the bead. (If you desire a cap design keep wrapping the wire down the bead.) Cut off the remainder of the tail with the cutters.

**Step 8:** Repeat steps 1-7 on every link of your necklace. In some places you may want to add 2-4 beads to achieve a fuller look.

**Step 9:** Attach the clasp with your jump rings by opening up a jump ring and using it as a link between the clasp and your necklace. Close the jump ring up again and you are finished.
