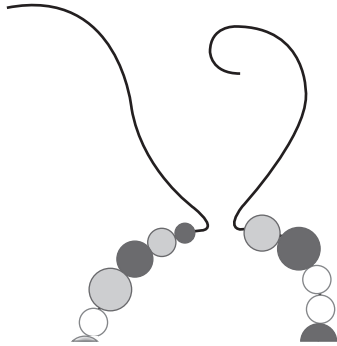
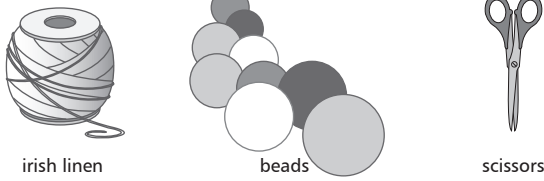
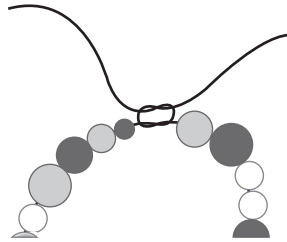


Irish linen with a tassel end

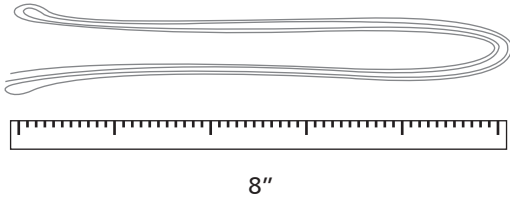
you will need the following supplies:



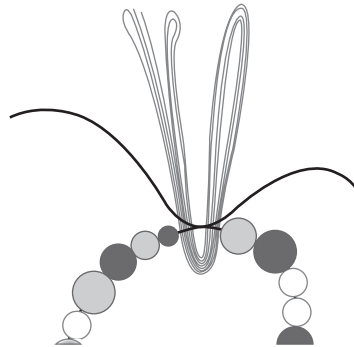
Step 1: This technique does not involve a clasp so make sure that your necklace is long enough to go over your head. Cut off enough linen to leave 8" of slack on each side. String your beads onto the Irish linen.



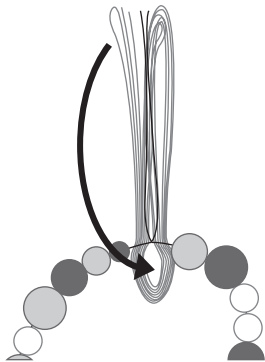
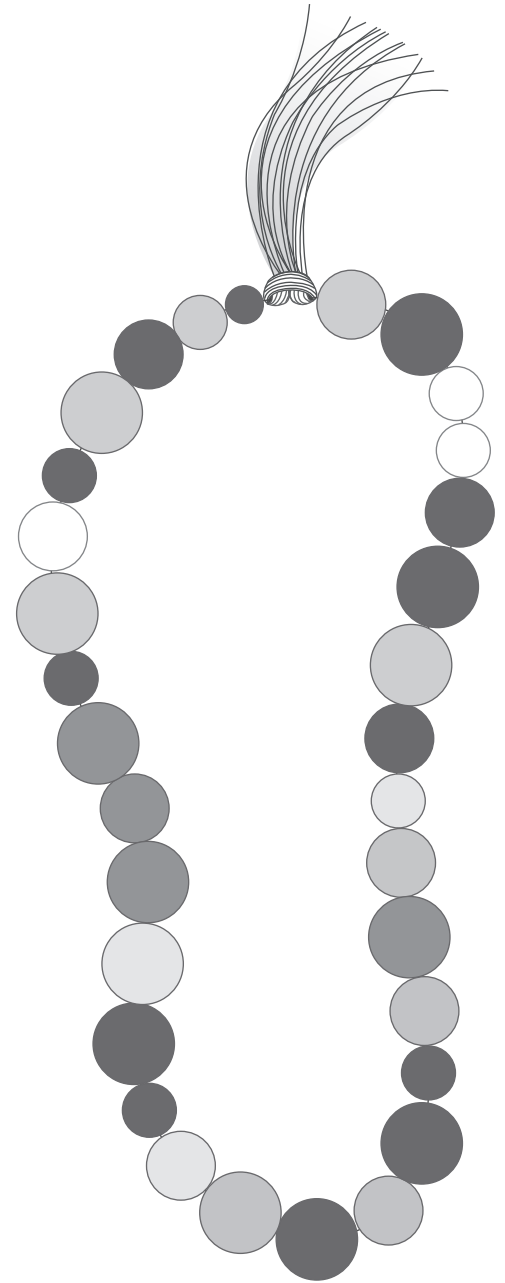
Step 2: Once you have threaded your beads and are happy with the length, tie off the ends with a double knot. Leave a small amount of space for the tassel.



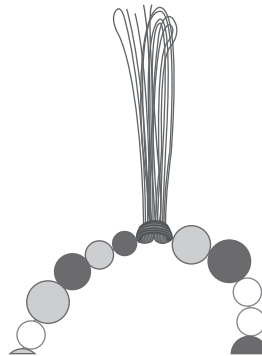
Step 3: Cut off approximately 6 feet of Irish linen and fold in half. Fold in half again, and again. This should leave you with a length of approximately 8".



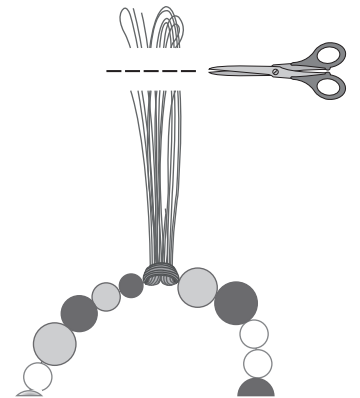
Step 4: Fold linen tassel in half one more time and place behind the double knot of the necklace with the "U" of the linen slightly below the knot.



Step 5: Combining the ends of the tassel along with the slack ends of the necklace, weave all the ends through the "U."



Step 6: Pull the ends to tighten the knot.



Step 7: With your scissors cut the ends evenly across to separate the strands.
